

Historian receives award

On April 5, 2018, Broome County and City of Binghamton Historian Gerald Smith received the 2016 Herbert H. Lehman Prize for Distinguished Service in New York History from the New York Academy of History.

He received the prize during the Gala Dinner for the Academy that was held at the Cosmopolitan Club in New York City.

The event had about 90 attending the dinner and it included former APHNYS President Carol McKenna,

and former board members Sharon Wilkins and Caledonia Jones.

Smith is the past president of APHNYS. He is the Head of the Broome County Local History &

Genealogy Center in the Broome County Public Library with an annual usage of 15,000 researchers, and sits on the board of the Broome County Historical Society, among many other groups.

Smith was appointed Binghamton City Historian in 1984 and County Historian in 1988. He is the author of five books on the Broome County area, and writes two weekly columns for the Press & Sun-Bulletin newspaper. In addition, he has a monthly radio segment entitled "Binghamton Then" on WNBF-AM radio.

Smith was APHNYS' first president from 1999-2000 and again from 2011-2016, as well serving in many board capacities.
